

How to find a website on the internet

The following instructions are for how to find a website on the internet when you know the website address.

A website address shows you a specific page on the internet.

It usually starts with [www.](#) and has no spaces. Here are some examples:

Manchester City Council website
www.manchester.gov.uk

NHS website
www.nhs.uk

UK Government website
www.gov.uk


Instructions

Let's find the Manchester City Council website www.manchester.gov.uk as an example.

1. First, turn on and unlock your device.
2. Tap the internet icon. The internet icon might look like one of these pictures.




3. The internet should open. Tap the search bar at the top.




4. A keyboard should appear. Type www.manchester.gov.uk



5. Tap the enter button.



6. You are on the Manchester City Council website.

4 easy tips to evaluate information online


WHO

- Who wrote the information?
- What were their reasons for writing it?



WHEN

- When was the information published?
- Is the information reviewed regularly?



WHERE

- What type of website is the information on?
- The ending of the website address can help you work it out:
 - .nhs.uk is an NHS website
 - .gov.uk is a government website
 - .ac.uk is an educational establishment
- You can also check the 'About' section of the website if it has one



STOP

- Stop and think before you follow advice or believe a story online
- Read beyond the headline to get the full story
- If something sounds too good to be true, it probably is
